12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Many have tried to describe both courage and fear; it is thought that fear exists in us all and is ever present, but courage must be summoned from deep within when facing those fears. It would be safe to say, however, that courage is most easily exhibited when it is accompanied by faith; one could even argue that courage simply cannot exist without faith. In our lives we are faced with challenges both large and small on a daily basis; without faith, how do we ever expect to muster the courage it will take to face down our challenges and dismiss our fears?



In today's Gospel reading from Mark, Jesus has just finished teaching to a large crowd from a boat. As evening fell, he and the others with him decided to sail to another shore for the evening. As Jesus slept, a storm arose and threatened to swamp the boats. His disciples feared for their lives; they were incredulous that Jesus could sleep through such danger. Waking up, Jesus calmed the storm, but turned to those who were so worried and questioned their faith. Without faith, was courage possible?

Perhaps no other time in our lives do we need to summon courage and strength more than when one of our loved ones is suffering from ill health. The sacrament of anointing of the sick has as its special grace an ability to allow the suffering one to face one's illness with strength, faith and courage (CCC 1532). But we must remember that we need courage every day. When we are faced with moral challenges, especially when we are alone, we are called to listen to that voice telling us what is right. 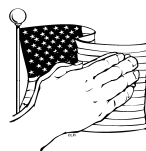
Catholic Relief Services:

In the small Mexican village of Colonia del Valle, Guadalupe Garcia greases her hands with lard and rapidly rolls a handful of dough into small balls. Her husband, Patricio, slaps the dough from one hand to the other before tossing it into an iron skillet where Guadalupe cooks the tortillas. He then heads out to distribute 1,200 tortillas to local supply stores. Through the profits he has made he has been able to afford a car, and no longer needs to deliver his tortillas on foot. The Garcias are running their business thanks to a microfinance loan they received through a CRS-supported program called "EnComún de la Frontera" (In Common Borders). The program provides working capital to laid off workers—after many U.S.-owned factories in the area closed their doors to look for cheaper labor overseas—and helps them build up their small businesses. The capital boost has allowed Patricio and Guadalupe to purchase a dough mixer. In turn they can make more tortillas, close to 2,400 a day, which they sell for 85 cents to \$1 per dozen. They have seen their business grow now to about 40 clients. "Being able to acquire equipment has been tremendous. It's not just a business but in our livelihood that we are investing," says Guadalupe. For more information, visit www.crs.org or www.crsespanol.org.
